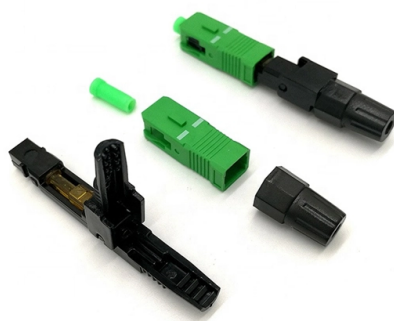

A branch circuit is a subsidiary electrical circuit that originates from a distribution box (also called a distribution board, panelboard, or breaker panel) and delivers power to specific loads such as lighting, outlets, or appliances . Each branch circuit is protected by its own circuit breaker or fuse, which prevents overloads and short circuits, ensuring safety for both the wiring and connected devices .

Components Involved

- Main Isolator: Controls the entire distribution box, allowing all power to be shut off during maintenance .
- Busbars: Solid metal bars (usually copper) that carry incoming power to all branch circuit breakers efficiently .
- Circuit Breakers: Protect each branch circuit individually by interrupting current flow in case of overload or fault .
- Residual Current Devices (RCDs) or RCBOs: Detect leakage currents and cut off power to prevent electric shocks .

- **Neutral and Earth Bars:** Provide proper grounding and neutral connections for all branch circuits .

Wiring and Configuration

Branch circuits are connected to the busbars via their respective breakers. The live (hot) wire from the busbar goes through the breaker, while the neutral and earth wires are connected to their respective bars . Proper organization ensures balanced electrical loads, reduces the risk of faults, and simplifies maintenance. In modern setups, comb busbars are often used to safely distribute power to multiple breakers without excessive wiring .

Safety and Maintenance

- Each branch circuit should be clearly labeled to identify its load.
- Overcurrent protection must match the wire size and load requirements.
- RCDs or RCBOs should be installed for circuits supplying wet areas or sensitive equipment.
- Regular inspection ensures no loose connections or overcrowding inside the distribution box .

Applications

Branch circuits are used in residential, commercial, and industrial systems to divide power efficiently and safely. They allow selective isolation of circuits for maintenance or fault detection without shutting down the entire system .
