Power Delivery Limitations

The PoE function cannot “push” power to a standard switch because non-PoE switches are not designed to draw power from Ethernet ports.

Practical Considerations

- If you want to use a PoE switch as a regular switch, you can disable the PoE function on its ports. This allows it to operate purely for data transmission without attempting to supply power .
- For networks where you need to power devices connected to a non-PoE switch, you can use a PoE injector upstream to provide power to compatible devices while the non-PoE switch handles data .
- Always ensure that connected devices are compatible with PoE standards to avoid potential damage from non-standard power delivery . In summary, a PoE switch can seamlessly connect to a regular switch for network communication, but it cannot supply electrical power to the non-PoE switch itself. Power delivery is limited to devices that support PoE.
