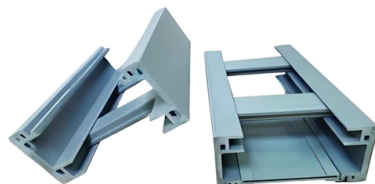


Color of optical cable loose tube



Overview

Loose-tube cables are commonly used in outdoor environments and consist of multiple tubes, each containing a set of fibers. The fibers inside each tube follow the standard 12-fiber color code. Tube Color Coding for Loose-Tube Cables. This Applications Note addresses Corning Optical Communications' identification scheme for optical fiber cables. " This standard is adopted by; Telcordia GR-20 – Generic Requirements for Optical Fiber and Optical. Understanding fiber-optic color codes is essential for any technician tasked with installing, maintaining, or troubleshooting modern fiber networks. Fiber 20 is clear (uncolored) since ring marking. In cables containing more than 12 tubes constructed in more than one layer, the color code repeats itself in each layer, starting from "Blue".

The TIA/EIA-598-C standard is the most widely followed guideline for color coding in optical fiber cables, both for loose-tube and ribbon fiber cables.

If fiber 13-24 are used in a loose tube design, the color sequence is repeated for fiber 13-24, but fibers are ring marked. Fiber 20 is clear (uncolored) since ring marking will not be visible on black colored

In tubes containing more than 24 fibers, the color code repeats itself from fiber #25, starting from "Blue/Black Stripe", but with 2 stripes instead of one. Additional color codes are available.

Loose tubes in cables ... **In cable with a multi-layer construction color of the tubes will be repeated in second layer ***In case of lower fiber count some tubes can be replaced by fillers

Decoding the Fiber Optic Color Codes

The TIA-598-C color code for fiber optics designates specific colors to individual fibers inside the cable or typically within each buffer tube in a loose tube fiber

FIBER & TUBE COLOURS INFORMATION

Generally, fibers are coated with colours for differentiation when they are manufactured as a multi-fiber cable. This is similar to the loose tube that contains the fiber in a cable, the tubes are also coloured
