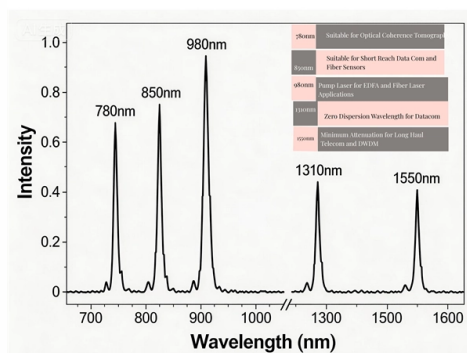

Cable Management

- Label all network cables for easy identification and maintenance .
- Use cable racks or organizers to prevent tangling and maintain airflow .
