An IP (Ingress Protection) rating consists of two digits following the letters "IP" that indicate the enclosure's resistance to solids and liquids .

- First digit (0-6): Protection against solid objects and dust. Higher numbers indicate better dust resistance. For example, 5 means dust-resistant, while 6 is completely dust-tight .
- Second digit (0-9K): Protection against water. Higher numbers indicate better water resistance, from no protection (0) to protection against high-pressure water jets or temporary submersion (9K), . If a digit is replaced by "X", it means the enclosure is not rated for that type of protection (solid or water), .

Common IP Ratings for Distribution Boxes

- IP30: Protects against large dust particles, no water resistance. Suitable for dry, clean indoor spaces like server rooms .

- IP40: Blocks small objects and dust, still no water resistance. Ideal for indoor utility closets or office ceilings .
 - IP54: Resists most dust and splashing water from any direction. Good for humid indoor areas such as kitchens or basements .
 - IP55: Full dust protection and low-pressure water jets. Suitable for semi-outdoor locations like covered patios or garage corners .
 - IP65: Completely dust-tight and resists powerful water jets. Designed for open outdoor areas like gardens or construction sites .
 - IP66: Dust-tight and withstands heavy water flooding. Recommended for harsh outdoor environments or industrial zones with high dust and water exposure .
- Testing and Standards

IP ratings are defined by IEC 60529, which specifies testing methods to verify protection levels . Dust tests involve circulating fine powders in a chamber for several hours, while water tests may include splashing, jets, or temporary submersion depending on the rating . These tests ensure that distribution boxes perform reliably in real-world conditions, from indoor offices to industrial or outdoor sites .

Choosing the Right IP Rating

- Indoor, dry areas: IP30–IP40
 - Indoor, humid or splash-prone areas: IP54
 - Semi-outdoor or occasional water exposure: IP55
 - Outdoor, exposed to rain or high-pressure cleaning: IP65–IP66
- Selecting the correct IP rating ensures safety, reliability, and longevity of electrical systems, preventing dust ingress, water damage, and potential hazards .

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The standard, prepared by IEC Technical Committee 70, uses the IP code to rate the degrees of protection offered by the enclosure

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IP65 Distribution Box SHA

IP represents the international protection level (Ingress Protection), 65 means dustproof level 6 and waterproof level 5. This grade of
