Outdoor Junction Box: The primary fiber optic junction box, often called a junction box, is installed on the exterior of a property, usually close to the fiber optic transfer point where the service provider's network enters the premises. This box is generally about the size of a mini-iPad and serves as the main connection point for the incoming fiber cable . It should be mounted in a location that is:

- Protected from direct sunlight and moisture to prevent damage to the sensitive fibers .
- Easily accessible for future maintenance or technician visits .



- Secure to prevent unauthorized access, often featuring a lock or tamper-resistant design . Indoor Box (ONT Connection): Inside the property, a second box, typically the Optical Network Terminal (ONT), is installed. This box converts the optical signal into data for devices and must be connected to a power outlet. It is usually placed in a convenient location for connecting routers or other network equipment .

Installation Considerations

- Wall Mounting: Both outdoor and indoor boxes are often mounted on walls using screws and dowels, ensuring they are level and secure .
- Cable Management: Fiber cables are delicate; the junction box should allow proper routing, maintain the standard bend radius, and protect fibers from dust or accidental handling .
- Environmental Protection: Outdoor boxes should be weatherproof, with IP65/IP68 ratings to withstand temperature fluctuations and moisture .
