A dual-function fiber optic panel is designed to support both fiber splicing and patching within the same enclosure. This allows network operators to terminate incoming fiber cables, splice them to pigtails, and provide front-access patching for easy connectivity to network devices. These panels are widely used in data centers, central offices, and enterprise networks to optimize space, reduce installation time, and simplify network management .

- **Modular Design:** Many dual-function panels, such as Amphenol's C2E/C2X chassis or CommScope's FPX series, allow the use of interchangeable modules or cassettes. This enables a “grow-as-you-go” approach, supporting both pre-terminated patch modules and splice trays in the same panel .
- **High-Density Deployment:** Panels can accommodate multiple cassettes or modules in 1U, 2U, or 4U configurations, supporting hundreds of fibers in a compact footprint .



- **Connector Compatibility:** These panels typically support LC, SC, MTP/MPO connectors for both singlemode and multimode fibers, providing flexibility for different network architectures .
