- ST (Straight Tip): Bayonet-style connector, commonly used in legacy networks.
- FC (Ferrule Connector): Screw-on type, often used in high-vibration environments.

Fiber Modes and Compatibility

Connectors are designed for single-mode or multimode fibers, which differ in core size and transmission characteristics . Using the correct connector type ensures minimal insertion loss and return loss, critical for maintaining signal integrity.

Fiber Optic Adapters

To connect two fiber optic cables, fiber optic adapters are often used. These adapters allow cables with the same or compatible connectors to mate securely, sometimes through walls or enclosures, and can provide environmental protection . Examples include SC-to-SC, LC-to-LC, or hybrid adapters for different connector types.

- Ensure connector cleanliness to prevent signal loss or damage.
- Match connector type and fiber mode for compatibility.
- Use high-quality adapters for reliable connections in high-density or outdoor environments.
