Fiber optic internet transmits data as light pulses through glass or plastic fibers, which standard routers cannot interpret directly. The fiber line entering your home terminates at an Optical Network Terminal (ONT), usually provided and installed by your internet service provider (ISP) and placed near the fiber entry point, such as a wall or closet. The ONT converts the optical signals into electrical signals compatible with standard networking equipment.

Connecting the ONT to Your Router

- **Fiber Cable to ONT:** The fiber optic cable from your ISP plugs into the ONT's optical port. Handle the fiber connector carefully to avoid dirt or damage.
- **Ethernet Link:** After conversion, the ONT outputs data via an Ethernet port. Use a high-quality Ethernet cable (Cat6 or Cat6a recommended) to connect the ONT to your router's WAN or Internet port.

- **Power Sequence:** Power on the ONT first to allow it to establish a connection with the ISP's network, then power on your router. Status lights on the ONT indicate connection health .

Router Requirements

To fully leverage fiber speeds, your router should support gigabit or multi-gigabit connections and modern Wi-Fi standards (Wi-Fi 5/6/7). Some routers include SFP or fiber-ready ports, but most home setups rely on the ONT to handle the optical-to-electrical conversion .

- Place the ONT and router in a dry, ventilated area near power outlets.
- Use wired connections for high-bandwidth applications to reduce latency.
- Keep firmware updated on both the ONT and router for security and performance.
- Consider routers with advanced QoS settings to prioritize traffic for streaming, gaming, or video calls .
