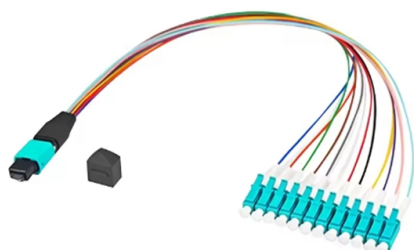


How long should the cable be reserved when exiting the distribution box



Overview

The general rule for NM cable is to secure the cable within 12 inches of the box and every 4. In the 2020 NEC ®, no. Where cabling is left in place it is fully removed from the distribution board, and any fittings are removed from the circuit. Cable ends are isolated and labelled as out of use in line with current regulations. In this installation, the un-sheathed NM cable exits the panel and runs through a 10" length of conduit; then the sheathed cable emerges from the conduit through an open conduit fitting (no clamp) and runs. Labeling cables at outlets is important so that when it comes time to attach wires to devices, you'll always know which switch controls which circuit. Labeling is equally important—perhaps more important—to identify the many cables converging on a panel box. Before you run each cable to the panel.

Arrangement order: The circuit breakers should be arranged from left to right, and the reserved position is generally placed on the right side of the distribution box.

Wire color: The neutral wire is blue, and the color of the phase wire (A phase is yellow, B phase is green, and C phase is red). In the 2020 NEC ®, no more than 18 inches of cable length is allowed between the cable entry to the box and the closest cable support (see image). Below is a preview of the NEC®.

Organizing a Panel Box

Once you have pulled cables into the box and tightened cable connectors, strip Romex cable sheathing, leaving at least 1/4 in. of sheathing extending into the panel box.

Receptacle Boxes and Cable Installation Codes

When electrical cables route from box to box, you must leave at least six inches of free conductor wiring in the junction box for connection purposes.

Control cables entering the capacitor bank area should be kept as close as possible to the ground grid conductors in the cable trench, or on top of the duct run, or in contact with the ground grid conductor
