Step-Down to Low Voltage

Before electricity enters homes or businesses, a distribution transformer connected to the distribution box reduces the medium voltage to a low-voltage secondary circuit, typically 120/240 volts AC in North America. This low-voltage output is what powers standard household appliances and lighting.

Safety Considerations



Medium-voltage lines in distribution boxes are considered high-voltage (above 600 V) and can be extremely dangerous. Only trained professionals should work near or on these boxes, as contact with these voltages can cause severe injury or death . The low-voltage side, after the transformer, is safe for standard residential wiring and devices.
