- Yellow: VoIP or telephony systems, helping distinguish voice traffic from data .
- Green: Security devices like IP cameras or access control systems, providing quick visual identification .
- Black: General-purpose patching or specialized connections, often used where no specific designation is required .
- White/Gray: Default or general patching, sometimes used for wireless access points or office workspaces .

- Orange: Demarcation points or cross-connects from ISPs/carriers, marking where external services enter the network .
 - Pink: Switch uplinks or vendor-managed networks, offering a clear visual distinction for non-standard applications .
 - Purple: Audiovisual equipment connections, separating AV traffic from standard data .
 - Beige: Digital or analog handsets, differentiating them from VoIP devices .
- Best Practices
- Consistency: Apply the chosen color scheme across the entire network to simplify troubleshooting and maintenance .
 - Documentation: Maintain a clear record of color assignments in network diagrams and labeling systems to prevent confusion .
 - Labeling: Combine color coding with printed labels on both ends of the patch cords for redundancy and clarity .
 - Environment Considerations: Use black or outdoor-rated cables for external or plenum installations to ensure durability and compliance . By following these conventions, network administrators can quickly identify cable functions, reduce errors during upgrades or troubleshooting, and maintain a scalable, organized rack environment.
