

How to calculate the length of a custom optical cable

To calculate a custom optical cable length, sum all route segments, add slack for bends, terminations, splices, and pull points, then include a safety factor for installation and future adjustments. Step 1: Measure the Route

Start by measuring the physical path the cable will follow. Break the route into segments such as conduit runs, tray paths, risers, vertical drops, and underground ducts. Multiply each segment by the number of times it will be used, then sum all segments to get the base length .

Step 2: Add Routing Slack

Include extra length to account for bends, corners, and elevation changes. Typical indoor installations use 10–15% slack, while complex or outdoor routes may require 20–25% . Slack ensures the cable can be pulled without stress and allows for future adjustments.

Step 3: Include Terminations and Splices



Add termination slack at each end (usually 1–3 meters per end) to protect connectors and allow re-termination. Include splice slack in closures or junctions to prevent fiber stress during maintenance .

Step 4: Account for Pull Points and Service Loops

If the cable passes through handholes, pull boxes, or cabinets, add extra length for pulling, dressing, and future access. Service loops near equipment simplify testing and maintenance .

Step 5: Apply a Safety Factor

Include a waste or safety factor (commonly 10%) to cover measurement errors, unexpected routing changes, or re-termination needs. Round up to the nearest reel size or purchase unit to avoid mid-run splices .

Step 6: Consider Custom Cable Specifications

For custom fiber optic cables, specify the exact requirements:

- Fiber type (e.g., G.657 bend-insensitive, OM5 for SWDM)
- Connector type (MTP/MPO, LC, or specialty)
- Armoring or ruggedized jackets for harsh environments
- Staggered breakout lengths for high-density racks to prevent tension and crowding

Step 7: Verify and Calculate Total Length

Sum the base length, slack, terminations, splices, pull points, and safety factor to get the total required cable length. Use a fiber optic cable length calculator if needed to automate the process and generate reel counts . By following these steps, you ensure the cable is long enough for installation, maintenance, and future adjustments, while minimizing waste and avoiding mid-run splices.
