- Drying: Allow the connector to air dry completely. Compressed air can accelerate drying, ensuring no moisture remains that could affect conductivity .
- Final Inspection: Check that all pins are clean, straight, and free of debris. Reconnect the connector and test functionality to ensure stable electrical performance .

- Regular Cleaning: Periodically clean connectors to prevent buildup and corrosion .
- Protective Covers: Keep connectors covered when not in use to reduce exposure to dust and moisture .
