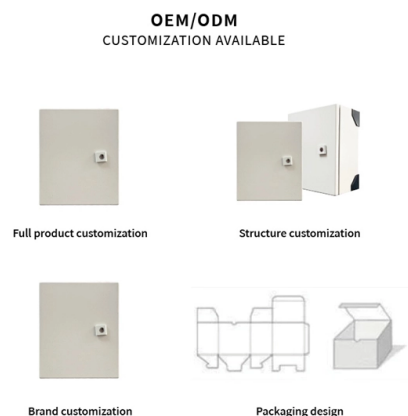


How to connect the fiber optic box terminal box

A Fiber Termination Box (FTB) serves as the junction between incoming fiber optic cables and outgoing pigtails or patch cords, providing protection, organization, and easy access for maintenance. A Terminal Box is typically installed at the user end or distribution point, where the optical fiber is connected to indoor or subscriber-side cables. Both boxes are designed to prevent fiber damage, maintain bend radius, and allow secure splicing or connectorization.

Connection Method

- Cable Preparation
- Strip the outer jacket of the incoming fiber cable carefully.
- Expose the bare fibers while protecting them from bending or contamination.
- Prepare the fiber ends according to supplier guidelines, ensuring clean and smooth surfaces for splicing.

- Cable Entry and Routing
- Insert the prepared cable into the box through the designated entry hole, often sealed with a rubber diaphragm.
- Route the fibers along plastic guide posts or trays inside the box to organize and protect them.
- Clamp the fiber at the splice tray entry point using plastic straps to prevent movement .
- Splicing to Pigtails
- Use fusion splicing to connect the incoming fiber cores to pre-installed pigtails inside the termination box.
- Ensure proper alignment and minimal signal loss during splicing.
- Place the spliced fibers into protective sleeves and store them in the splice tray to prevent damage .
- Excess Fiber Management
- Coil any extra fiber from the line side or pigtails neatly in the splice tray.
- Maintain the minimum bend radius to avoid attenuation or breakage .
- Connection to Terminal Box
- The pigtails from the FTB are routed to the terminal box, where they can be connected to indoor cables or patch cords.
- Terminal boxes may be straight-through (single input) or branched-type (multiple outputs), depending on network design .
- Inside the terminal box, fibers can be spliced, connected via mechanical connectors, or routed to splitters for distribution.

Installation Considerations

- Mount the FTB or terminal box in an accessible location, either on walls, racks, or poles, depending on indoor or outdoor deployment .
- Ensure compatibility with connector types (SC, LC, FC, ST) and network capacity.
- Protect fibers from dust, moisture, and mechanical stress, especially in outdoor installations with IP65/IP68-rated enclosures .
- Only skilled technicians should perform splicing and installation to maintain signal integrity and network reliability . By following these steps, the fiber optic box and terminal box connection ensures a secure, organized, and efficient optical network, supporting FTTH, FTTB, or other fiber deployments.
