

How to install a household electrical distribution box casing

Step 1: Choose the Installation Location

Select a dry, accessible, and well-ventilated area for the distribution box. Avoid locations near water, flammable or corrosive substances, and ensure the box is easy to reach for maintenance. - Wear insulating gloves, safety glasses, and non-slip shoes during installation .
