Before installation, plan the tray route carefully, considering the location of the distribution box, cable entry points, and future maintenance access. Ensure the tray does not obstruct the panel doors or ventilation openings and maintains adequate clearance from walls, floors, and other equipment . Mark the route on the site according to approved electrical drawings.

Tray Type Selection

Choose a tray type suitable for the cables and environment:

- Ladder trays: Ideal for power cables, allow airflow, and easy cable entry .
- Perforated or ventilated trough trays: Suitable for control or instrumentation cables, providing continuous support and preventing sagging .



- Solid-bottom trays: Used where extra protection from dust or liquids is needed .

Mounting and Support

- Use brackets, clamps, or hangers to secure the tray. Supports should be spaced according to tray type and load, typically 1.2–3 meters apart for horizontal runs .
- Maintain a minimum clearance of 50 mm from the floor if the tray is mounted under the distribution box to avoid direct contact and allow cleaning or inspection .
- Ensure the tray is level, straight, and aligned with the distribution box entry points for smooth cable routing .

Cable Management and Safety

- Segregate different cable types (power, control, data) to prevent interference and overheating .
- Install retaining bars or insulating devices at tray edges to prevent cables from falling when covers are removed .
- Ensure proper grounding and bonding of the tray system to comply with NEC Article 392 and local electrical codes .
- After installation, inspect for debris, sharp edges, or burrs, and apply rust-proofing or paint touch-ups as needed .

Final Steps

- Pull cables carefully, avoiding excessive bending or tension.
- Install end caps and covers to protect cables.
- Label the tray and cables for identification and future maintenance.
- Conduct a final inspection to verify alignment, support spacing, and compliance with approved drawings . By following these steps, a cable tray installed under a distribution box will be safe, accessible, and compliant with electrical standards, ensuring long-term reliability and ease of maintenance.
