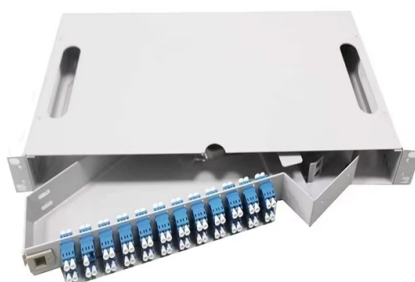


How to replace the pigtail connector
