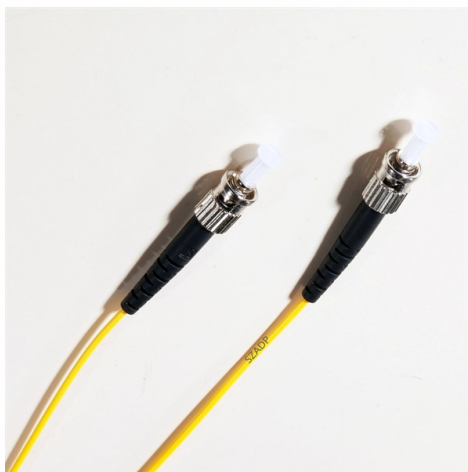


Intrinsically safe cable separate cable tray



Overview

If you already have it in Cable Tray with other cables, it needs to be separated by 50mm (2in) (or a partition), unless they are in a grounded metal sheath. Are intrinsically safe and non-intrinsically safe cables allowed to be laid together if both cables are shielded?

Intrinsically safe and non-intrinsically safe cables are allowed to be laid together in a cable duct or on a cable tray if at least one of the two cables is shielded and the shield is. Junction boxes should be marked with a label "WARNING intrinsically safe circuits". IS cables should have elastomeric or thermoplastic insulation with a minimum thickness of 0. The conductors, includes the individual strands of finely. But, the generally accepted proper way to run cabling from a cable tray to instrumentation would be to install the cable in conduit.
