- Run the Fiber Cable: Carefully lay the fiber along the planned path. Use the adhesive or mounting tools provided to secure it. Avoid sharp bends; most ultra-thin fibers tolerate bends down to 2.5mm radius .

- **Install Media Converters:**
- At the network port panel, connect the fiber end to the fiber input port of the media converter.
- Connect an Ethernet cable from the media converter's Ethernet port to the network panel port.
- At the device end, connect the fiber to the second media converter and then use an Ethernet cable to connect to the device (computer, router, or switch), .
- **Power On Devices:** Plug in the media converters and ensure they are powered. Wait for the status lights to stabilize, indicating a successful fiber link .
- **Test the Connection:** Verify connectivity by checking the network device or running a speed test. Disable Wi-Fi if necessary to force the device to use the wired connection .

Additional Tips

- Do not attempt to splice broken fiber; replace it if damaged .
- Future adjustments require a new fiber path; once adhered, the fiber cannot be moved .
- **Compatibility:** Ensure your network devices support Ethernet connections; the media converters handle the fiber-to-Ethernet conversion, so no special router is required . By following these steps, you can integrate an invisible fiber optic cable into your network panel, achieving a clean, high-speed, and visually unobtrusive connection.
