Not all routers can connect directly to a fiber optic line. Routers without an integrated fiber modem require a separate ONT (Optical Network Terminal) provided by your ISP. Only specialized fiber optic routers, such as certain FRITZ!Box models, can connect directly to the fiber socket without an external modem, simplifying setup and ensuring full speed delivery to your home network . Direct fiber routers combine modem and router functions, reducing potential points of failure and cable clutter .

Key Features to Look For

- Fiber Standards Support: Ensure the router supports GPON, AON, or XGS-PON, depending on your ISP .
- Multi-Gig WAN Ports: For fiber plans above 1 Gbps, routers should have at least 2.5 Gbps or 10 Gbps WAN ports to avoid bottlenecks .
- Wi-Fi Standards: Wi-Fi 6 or Wi-Fi 7 routers maximize wireless performance, allowing multiple devices to use high-speed fiber simultaneously .

- LAN Aggregation: Some routers allow combining LAN ports for faster wired speeds, useful for multi-gigabit setups .

- Mesh and Coverage Options: Routers with mesh support or additional repeaters ensure consistent high-speed coverage across larger homes .
