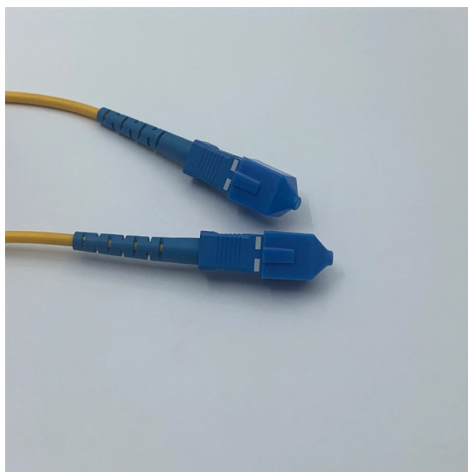


Near-end hazards of network patch panels
