In factories, construction sites, and even commercial buildings, this question pops up all the time. I don't see one on the main panel however The neutral bus is bonded (green screw) to the enclosure. It's sort of grounded if there is a ground cable from a ground rod & cold water pipe. They should never be connected together downstream of the service equipment, such as in subpanels or other parts of the circuits.
