Outdoor fiber optic cables use outer jacket colors to help technicians quickly identify the type of fiber and its intended application:

- Yellow: Indicates single-mode fiber (OS1/OS2), commonly used for long-distance or backbone networks .
 - Orange: Represents traditional multimode fiber (OM1/OM2), suitable for shorter-distance connections .
 - Aqua: Used for laser-optimized multimode fibers (OM3/OM4/OM5), often deployed in high-speed data centers .
 - Purple: Sometimes used in Europe to identify OM4 or OM5 fibers . These colors help prevent misconnection and simplify maintenance in complex outdoor installations .
- Individual Fiber Color Coding



Inside the cable, each fiber strand is also color-coded according to standards (TIA/EIA-598) to facilitate splicing and identification:

- Standard sequence for up to 12 fibers: blue, orange, green, brown, slate, white, red, black, yellow, violet, rose, aqua .
- For cables with more than 12 fibers, the sequence repeats with additional markings or stripes to differentiate groups .

Considerations for Outdoor Installations

Outdoor cables may also have armored or dielectric jackets for protection against environmental hazards, but the color coding remains consistent to indicate fiber type . Loose tube, ribbon, and micro cables all follow these color conventions, ensuring compatibility and ease of identification across different installation methods . By following these color standards, technicians can efficiently manage outdoor fiber networks, reduce errors, and maintain reliable performance in harsh environments.
