

Regulations on the Size of Openings for Distribution Boxes

The National Electrical Code provision 110. 26 clarifies that electrical boxes must be supplied with at least 3 feet of free space surrounding them for safety measures. Openings around boxes in noncombustible surfaces must not exceed $\frac{1}{4}$ inch to prevent fire spread. Boxes must be securely fastened to the structure using approved methods such as:

Service entrance conductors (wires that bring electricity from the utility) must be appropriately sized and installed to meet load demands and NEC requirements.

TECHNICAL SERVICES DEPARTMENT

Only a single drainage opening, not larger than 6 mm ($\frac{1}{4}$ in.) nor smaller than 3 mm ($\frac{1}{8}$ in.), is to be drilled in a box or conduit body unless instructed by the manufacturer.
