Types of Sheathed Wire

- NM-B (Nonmetallic-Sheathed Cable): Commonly used in residential and light commercial applications. It contains two or more insulated conductors plus a ground wire, enclosed in a PVC sheath. Suitable for dry, protected locations and concealed installations.
- NMC (Moisture- and Corrosion-Resistant Cable): Similar to NM-B but designed for damp or mildly corrosive environments. Can be used in cable trays or areas exposed to moisture.



- **Industrial Multi-Core Sheathed Cables:** For commercial or industrial 3-phase DBs, use cables with three live conductors, a neutral, and an earth conductor, all insulated and enclosed in a durable PVC or XLPE sheath. These are rated for higher currents and voltages, compatible with MCCBs and other protective devices .

Installation Considerations

- **Phase and Neutral Connections:** Each phase wire should connect to its respective breaker, and the neutral wire should connect to the neutral busbar. The earth wire must connect to the earth busbar for safety .
- **Cable Sizing:** Select wire gauge based on total load current, distance, and voltage drop. Oversized cables reduce heating and improve safety .
- **Protection:** Ensure the sheathed cable is protected from mechanical damage, especially in exposed areas. Use conduits or cable trays where necessary .
- **Compliance:** Follow local electrical codes (NEC, IEC, or IEEE standards) for sheathed cable installation, grounding, and phase sequencing .
