Common Causes

- Identify the tripped switch: Look for a breaker that is in the “off” or middle position.
- Reset safely: Flip the breaker fully to the “off” position, then back to “on” ().
- Test devices one at a time: Turn on appliances individually to identify if a specific device is causing the trip. If the breaker trips again, unplug the last device and report it if it's provided by the dormitory ().

Safety Precautions

- Avoid using damaged cords or appliances.
- Do not attempt to bypass the breaker.
- If the breaker trips repeatedly after resetting, contact dormitory maintenance immediately ().
- For prolonged outages, have a flashlight, warm clothing, and a safe way to cook or boil water if needed (). By following these steps, you can safely restore power while identifying potential hazards and preventing further electrical issues.
