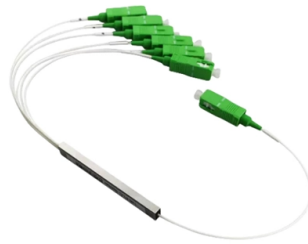


What are fusible fibers made of
