Structure and Layers

- Core: The central strand of glass or plastic through which light travels. Single-mode fibers have a very small core (~9 microns) for long-distance transmission, while multi-mode fibers have larger cores (50-62.5 microns) for shorter distances .
- Cladding: Surrounds the core and reflects light back into it, maintaining signal integrity .
- Coating: A protective layer around the cladding that cushions the fiber and makes it easier to handle .

- **Strengthening fibers:** Materials like Kevlar provide tensile strength, preventing damage when the cable is pulled or bent .
 - **Outer jacket:** The external plastic layer, often color-coded (yellow for single-mode, orange for multi-mode), protecting the cable from environmental damage .
- Connectors

Fiber optic cables for routers usually have SC/APC or SC/UPC connectors, which are push-pull types designed for secure connections to an Optical Network Terminal (ONT) or fiber-ready router . Some routers may use SFP or SFP+ modules for fiber input, allowing the cable to plug into a small transceiver slot . The connectors are typically small, cylindrical, and may have a green (APC) or blue (UPC) tip to indicate the polishing type.

Appearance in Use

In a home setup, the fiber optic cable is often thin, flexible, and yellow, running from the wall outlet to the ONT, and then connected to the router via Ethernet if the router does not have a direct fiber port . The cable is delicate, so care must be taken to avoid sharp bends or kinks, which can degrade signal quality. Overall, a fiber optic cable for a router is a compact, high-performance cable designed to carry light signals efficiently, distinguishable by its thin strands, protective layers, and specialized connectors.
