

What is a network cabinet with sockets called



Overview

A 19-inch rack is a standardized frame or enclosure for mounting multiple electronic equipment modules. Each module has a front panel that is 19 inches (482.6 mm) wide. The 19 inch dimension includes the edges or ears that protrude from each side of the equipment, allowing the module to be fastened to the rack frame with screws or bolts.

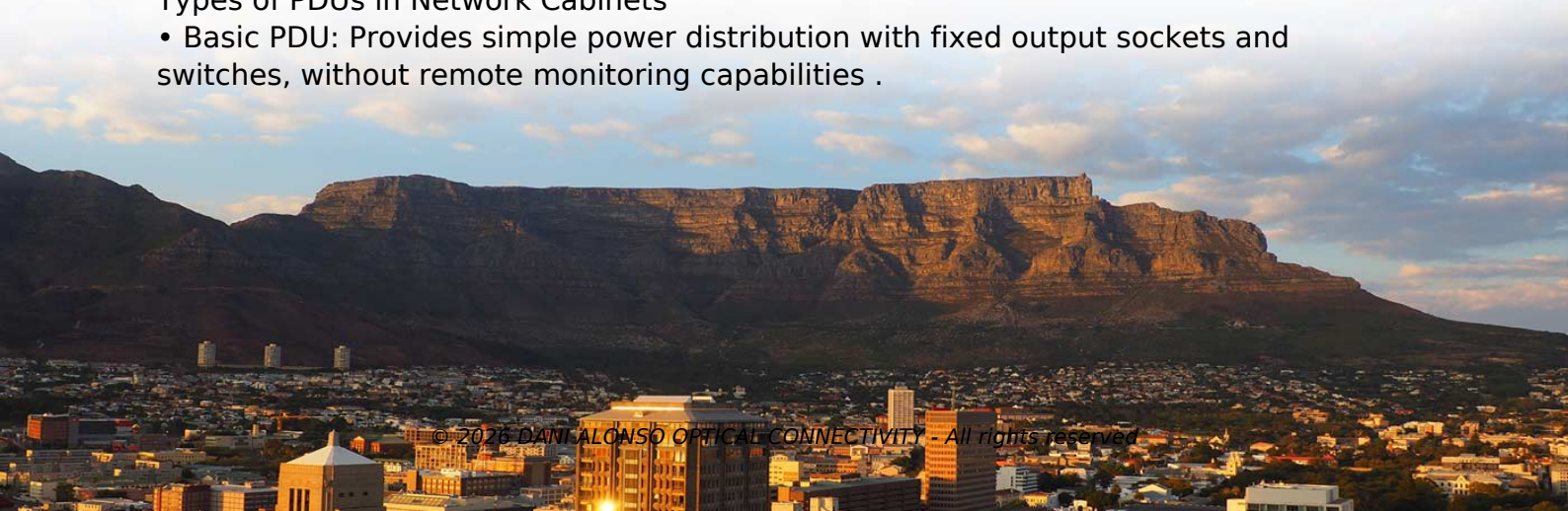

A network cabinet (also known as a network rack or server rack) is an enclosure designed to house and organize networking equipment such as switches, routers, patch panels, and servers, providing security, airflow, and efficient cable management . When these cabinets include power sockets for distributing electricity to the mounted devices, the component responsible is called a PDU (Power Distribution Unit) .

Types of PDUs in Network Cabinets

- Intelligent or Smart PDU: Offers advanced features such as real-time monitoring of voltage, current, and power consumption, remote control of sockets, timing switches, and fault alarms .

Usage

PDUs are installed vertically or horizontally inside the network cabinet, allowing multiple devices to be powered efficiently while maintaining a neat and organized setup. This setup is common in data centers, server rooms, and IT closets, where centralized power management is critical for uptime and safety .
