Before touching any wiring, turn off the main breaker and verify that circuits are de-energized using a non-contact voltage tester. Always wear insulated gloves and safety glasses and ensure the area is dry and well-lit . Never attempt to label or trace circuits while the panel is live.

Step-by-Step Labeling Process

- Prepare Tools and Assistance: You will need a partner, a nightlight or small appliance, and durable labels or a label maker .
- Turn Off All Breakers: Start with all breakers in the off position.
- Test Each Circuit Individually: Turn on one breaker at a time while your partner checks which outlets, lights, or appliances receive power. This helps identify the area or device each breaker controls .

- **Label Clearly and Specifically:** Avoid vague terms like “Room 1.” Use descriptive labels such as “Kitchen Lights,” “Master Bedroom Sockets,” or “Water Heater” .

- **Document Special Circuits:** Mark circuits with GFCI or AFCI protection, and heavy appliances that require dedicated lines .

- **Repeat for All Breakers:** Continue until every breaker is identified and labeled.

- Use vinyl or polyester labels for longevity .

- Ensure labels are legible and resistant to fading.

- Keep a diagram or list of the panel layout for future reference.

- Update labels whenever circuits are modified or new appliances are added .
